HVCC Women's Basketball Scores Impressive Win

Hudson Valley Women's Basketball had an impressive win on Tuesday against No. 15 North Country. Hudson Valley has won 4 of their last 5 with a tough matchup, which ended 64-62.

The game was a back and forth competition for all 40 minutes as neither team was able to take a meaningful lead.

The stat board showed how close it was, as both teams shot 33% from the field, had 16 turnovers, and the only real difference was Hudson Valley came away with 60 rebounds against North Country's 54 thanks to a team effort in the paint.

Hudson Valley's starters showed up strong; Payton Graber was tenacious in the paint, coming away with 17

rebounds and leading the team with 17 points and 5 assists. Nya Ewans-Edmonds was right behind with 16 points and 12 rebounds. Tylah Langley was strong on rebounds as well with 10 and 10 points to match. Leemya Garcia had 9 points and Sidney Phillips rounded out the starters with 8.

The Vikings bench didn't see much playing time against the strong North Country team as Alyssa Bruno and Trinity Cutler-Mujjumbire both had 2 points off the bench.

Hudson Valley faces off next against Finger Lakes Community College at home on Sunday, January 29th.

Excelsior Scholarship Now Available To Students

New York states applications for the Excelsior Scholarship are open for Spring 2023.

The Excelsior scholarship is a scholarship that helps students attend a SUNY or a CUNY school tuition-free. While it doesn't cover any other college costs besides tuition fees, there are some

things to keep in mind before accepting or applying.

Eligibility requirements are as follows - while these are main ones, we recommend looking at the rest on the SUNY website.

You must:

- Be A U.S. citizen or an eligible non-U.S. citizen, be a resident of NYS and have been a year before applying.

- Be pursuing a degree at a SUNY or a CUNY school

- Must have a gross income of \$125,000 or less.

- Other things to keep in mind:

- You must live and work in New York for time you receive the scholarship.

For example, if the scholarship was granted to you, and you earned an associate degree from it, you must live and work in NYS for two years after graduation.

If you do decide to move out of New York State, it will become a no-interest loan.

Many people who need assistance in paying for college take out loans, and most of these loans have interest. The interest on these loans prevents many

students from paying their loans back because the interest keeps increasing. So if you end up having to pay it back, you wouldn't have any interest.

In summary, if you think you are eligible or want to apply, please do. It will benefit you in the long run no matter what you do.

Young Thug's Career Could Be Coming To An End

Things aren't looking good for Atlanta-native rapper Young Thug (real name: Jeffrey Williams). After a lengthy series of trials, the book may be closing on his career, and it seems that he's facing serious jail time.

He was placed under police custody on May 9th, 2022, and has been imprisoned ever since, facing an indictment of 65 charges. Fortunately for Williams, most of these charges have been

dismissed in the time since then, but 8 still remain, which still pose a major threat to him and his freedom. These eight charges include conspiracy to violate the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act (RICO), two counts of participation in criminal street gang activity, among a handful of drug possession charges with the intent to distribute, and firearm possession charges, including a machine gun. The court alleges that Williams' record label YSL (Young Slime Life) doubles as a criminal enterprise and street gang, with Williams standing at the top, controlling a large fraction of the crime in Atlanta.

Things for Williams have become even worse in recent hours, however, with a video surfacing yesterday (at the time of writing this article) showing an

alleged "hand-to-hand" drug deal taking place in the courtroom, in the

ens) admitting gang affiliation via a guilty plea, it appears Slime Season may finally be over.

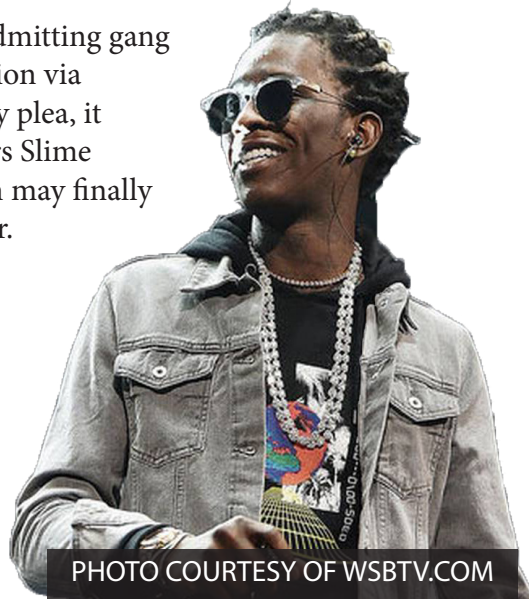

Representatives To Help Students Apply For Insurance Coverage And Assistance

Do you have insurance? The 2020 U.S. Census found that “People [ages 19 to 34] had an average uninsured rate of 15.6% compared to 5.7% for those under 19, 11.3% for adults ages 35 to 64, and 0.8% for individuals 65 and older in 2019.”

Choosing an insurance plan can be very daunting for young adults, and some may not even know whether they are eligible or not. It’s a new experience that most young adults have no experience with. Luckily, Yalisa Lorenzo, Rebecca Stern, and the rest of their team at United Healthcare are here to help.

Every Tuesday from 10 am to 3 pm in CRT 270, these representatives are available to help you sign up for insurance or answer any questions you may have. Yalisa and the

rest of the Essential Plan account managers can also aid in helping people looking to qualify or receive information for other forms of assistance (HEAP, WIC, etc.).

The main plan being offered is the Essential Plan, through the New York State Healthcare marketplace. According to the HVCC Student Announcements, “It has no deductible, so the plan starts paying for your health care right away. It covers comprehensive benefits, including dental and vision, inpatient and outpatient hospital care, prescription drugs, and more. It also covers free preventive care like routine doctor exams and screenings to keep you healthy.”

To apply, all that is required is a name, social security number, address, and/or one month’s worth of recent pay stubs. This coverage and other necessary documents apply to immigrants without a social security number as well. If you are lacking an address or stable housing, a shelter’s address or a P.O. box may be used as well.

Uncertainty about wom-

en’s bodily rights stemming from last year’s Roe v. Wade decision can be a major factor when deciding on what insurance you choose. The Essential Plan offers full coverage for all women’s health needs, including sexual health-related needs.

For those that are gender transitioning, hormone treatment is covered, and gender reassignment (with stipulations and rules) can be covered.

If you already have insurance, United Healthcare offers secondary or supplemental insurance to help better cover you. If you are uninsured and had a recent injury or illness, the Essential Plan can (possibly) cover up to 3 months prior to the sign-up date if applicable. Judge Denies 30-Day Jail Period On Andrew Tate Case

American-British media personality Andrew Tate, along with his brother, Tristan, and two other unnamed suspects were taken into custody on December 30, 2022, in Bucharest Romania on charges of human trafficking and association with an organized crime ring.

Andrew Tate is well-known among MMA fans and younger men. A former championship kickboxer and self-described “misogynist”, Tate garnered attention on the internet for his inflammatory takes on gender relations and women. During his rise to fame as a contestant on the U.K. version of Big Brother in 2016, Tate was swiftly removed from the house when two videos showed Tate abusing two different women. Even though Tate was removed from the show over the abuse allegations, both Tate and his ex-girlfriends that appeared in each video, claim the videos were nothing more than a “kink”.

In 2017, Tate tweeted distasteful comments in response to the rising #MeToo movement. Tweeting, “Sexual harassment is disgusting and inexcusable. However, a man looking at you or whistling at you or asking your name isn’t harassment.” And “Next point, if you put yourself in a position to be [assaulted], you must bear some responsibility. I’m not saying it’s OK you got [assaulted].”

These tweets resulted in a ban on Tate’s Twitter account for violating their policies. Tate would go on to make three more accounts, getting Twitter verification on one of them.

Later that year, Tate and his brother would move to Romania from England. His given reasons, which he posted in a YouTube video that has been since deleted, were the backlash from the #MeToo movement and quote, “People say: ‘oh you are a [redacted].’ No, I am not, I like being able to do what I want, I like being free.”

It wasn’t until 2022 that Tate’s name and influence would rear its head in public news again. In April 2022, Andrew Tate’s Romanian home was raided after a tip was called to the police claiming a woman in the house

was being held against their will. While the Tate brothers were brought in for questioning, Andrew would later publicly lambast the woman and boyfriend that called the police in his podcast. Romanian police have stated that the Tate brothers were only brought in as witnesses and were never charged with anything.

In December of the same year, in a Twitter exchange between Tate and climate change activist, Greta Thunberg, Tate’s history was brought into question, and made his subsequent arrest into international news.

In a horrible attempt at trolling, Tate brags about his “33” cars and tweets, “Please provide your email address so I can send a complete list of my car collection and their respective enormous emissions.” At the young climate activist. Greta fired back with one of the most liked tweets of all time, “yes, please do enlighten me. email me at smalldickenergy@getalife.com.”

The uproar of support and memes generated by such a response caused Tate to later respond with the now-infamous video depicting himself and the pizza box that caused so many rumors to be spread online. While these rumors were disproved later on by Romanian police, the absurdity and believability of the rumor spread knowledge about Tate outside the normal circle of followers that normally gravitate towards him.

Recently, the judge overseeing the case denied a motion to appeal the 30-day jail period that they are still currently serving.

In my life, I've encountered very few auditory experiences as viscerally off-kilter as Death Grips' *The Powers That B*. This 2015 double-LP is filled to the brim with musical oddities, which makes itself very clear the moment you press play. The first track, *Up My Sleeves*, greets you with a repetitive chant of "up my sleeves," before the song dissolves into insanity. It's hard to imagine that vocalist MC Ride was on planet Earth when he wrote these lyrics. In usual Death Grips fashion, it's hard to get a grip on whatever Ride's talking about, but you can detect the usual traces of nihilism subtly and not-so-subtly woven into the nonsensically abstract lyrics. "I take my life like I kept it, up my sleeves never sounds like you meant it," and "tisk tisk tisk, my terracotta army, disarms me, disowns me", serve as two examples of this. While I'm at a loss for what the former refers to, other than suicidal contemplation, I do have a guess as to what the latter may mean. The first emperor of China, Qin Shi Huang, was buried with terracotta sculptures of his army, in hopes that they would protect him in the afterlife. Perhaps when MC Ride refers to this, he means to imply that nothing waits for him in the world beyond, and he's doomed whether he chooses to live or die. However, as with most Death Grips lyrics, this is just a guess. We'll never truly know what he had in mind.

The intro track is far from the peak of this album's absurdity, however. The following track, *Billy Not Really* is so abstract and obtuse that I

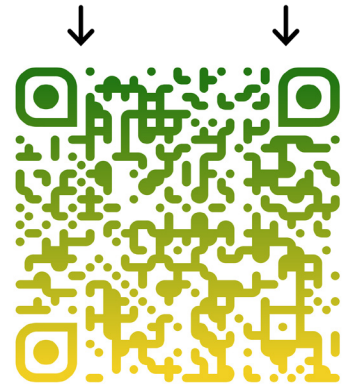


couldn't give you a serious guess on what this song is even about. The chorus of "Billy, Billy, not really, yo, oi, yo, amnesia," will strike casual listeners as irritating, but more open-minded listeners may find it adventurous, outside of the box, and even hypnotic to a degree. MC Ride's nonsensical rambling coupled with heavily computerized, harsh instrumentals, and coupled with Zach Hill's raw, aggressive skills on the drum set, makes for a highly energetic and enthralling song. Perhaps the most interesting song on the first disc of the double album, *Big Dipper*, is heavily chaotic, with an instrumental that treads the line

between simple and complex. MC Ride is considerably more relaxed on this track than he is on the ones leading up to this point, but his iconic shouting is still very much present in the song's chorus. After a surreal outro of hyper-distorted pitched up vocal samples from acclaimed singer Bjork, the second disc of this double album is ushered in with *I Break Mirrors With My Face in The United States*, a very odd song about America's distaste with the perceived ugliness behind Death Grips' music. This half of the album is far more focused on a hard-rock type of sound compared to its more technologically driven counter-

part, but still incorporates hyper-weird electronic instrumentation into its design, which is further elevated by MC Ride's weird vocal inflections and bizarre lyrics alike. This is put on a very apt display by the two songs *Beyond Alive* and *On GP*, which border on anthem rock, with a surrealist Death Grips twist. The most interesting song on this half to me, however, is titled *Inanimate Sensation*, defined by its heavy bass and strange chorus; a vocal rendition of a motor engine speeding down the road. Obviously, for many people, something like this is far from appealing, but I urge you to check it out regardless. The works of Death Grips are very much an acquired taste. Nobody has been known to like them right off the bat, but investing your time into listening to and understanding their music is one of the most rewarding experiences in the grand scope of music. *The Powers That B* is a triumphant compilation of the unpredictable nature of Death Grips and their music, and holds some of the very best stuff the band has to offer. For those who are looking to get into Death Grips, I'd recommend you start with their first studio album, *The Money Store*, which you can find on all streaming services. As far as Death Grips standards go, *The Money Store* is the closest thing they have to traditional music, and is a great jumping off point for new fans. Be warned, though, it's still far unlike most things you've ever heard. Happy listening!

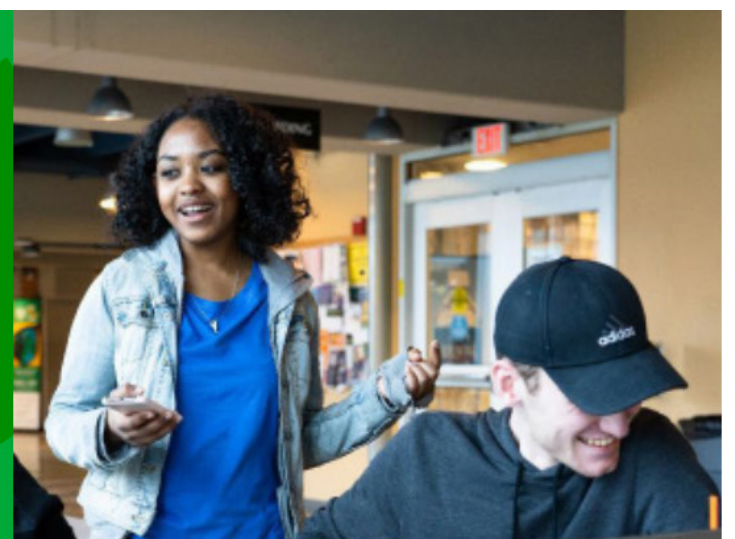
